## EAGLETON AND LIMBAUGH COURTHOUSE BUILDING STATUS

- Per the Court's <u>December 15, 2020 Order</u>, the Courthouses are closed for trials, but open for limited scheduled in-person hearings or by specific appointment scheduled with a Court or agency, through March 15, 2021.
- The <u>December 15, 2020 Order</u> sets forth protocols for building entry due to COVID. Anyone who cannot enter or is unwilling to enter any courthouse in violation of the protocols will be referred by a Court Security Officer to the Court or agency with whom the person has business, in the manner directed by the Court or agency.
- Contact Information for each Court and agency is provided online and at district courthouses.

# **CIVIL CASES**

- Per the Court's <u>December 15, 2020 Order</u>, all civil proceedings will be remote, unless a specific in-person exception is directed by the Presiding Judge in the case.
- All in-person ADR requirements are suspended until further Order of the Court. All parties needing additional scheduling relief should consult with opposing parties and motion the Court.
- Drop boxes are available in lobby areas for self-represented litigants (SRLs). Drop boxes are for filings only. All items will be scanned by security.
- SRLs can also file cases by e-mail during this time, see Public Notice of April 9 for instructions.
- Per the Court's <u>April 22 Order</u>, statutory deadlines for administrative and civil judicial asset forfeiture proceedings and actions have been extended.

#### CRIMINAL CASES

- As stated in the <u>December 15 Order</u>, all trials are continued to a date no sooner than March 15, 2021, but a limited number of non-trial in-person criminal proceedings are permitted. All other criminal hearings will be held remotely. The Speedy Trial Act is waived for those jury trials that are continued due to these limitations.
- As set out in the <u>December 15 Order</u>, videoconferencing and teleconferencing are to be used for criminal proceedings unless the defendant does not consent or unless otherwise directed by the presiding judge. Per the Court's <u>April 29 Order</u>, processes for combined pleas and sentencings have been created.
